Description

The Practical Nursing program is a two-year comprehensive program for dedicated students seeking to obtain certification through the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX). This program consists of theory, laboratory practice and clinical experience. Students interact with our internet-based student learning management system that involves reading assignments, workbook activities, skills lab activities, computer assisted learning software, videos, course review sessions, discussion, special projects and guest speakers. Experienced Instructors are mentors that guide students in the learning process. Students gain invaluable skills through work-based partnerships outside campus and in the community.

Application

Applicants must complete a SouthernTech Application for Admission. Additional information and applications are available at the SouthernTech campus and online at www.sotech.edu. Enrollment for this career major is open to adults, 18 years of age or older with high school diploma or equivalent.

Schedule

Students must attend a minimum of 16 hours per week. Each course has scheduled review and testing session requirements. Campus is available to students Monday through Thursday from 8:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m. and on Fridays from 8:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. School is closed each day from 11:15 a.m. to 12:15 p.m. for lunch, unless otherwise posted. Clinical experience is divided into five daytime rotations ranging from 6:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m. and 120 hours of role transition/ preceptorship totaling 688 hours. Students attend a review and testing sessions once weekly with an average of two clinical days per week.
